A few ways to capture/edit video!

Blackboard - Embed Video

You can embed video into BlackBoard. You don't have to load video files into the Content collection folder! BlackBoard has the new "mashup" tool. Click on the BlackBoard Learn videos on the web page – left side to learn more!

TubeChop - Crop Video

Once a video is selected, click the "Chop" button. Select the part you want by dragging the two black sliders that appear under the video to choose the desired start and end times of your chopped piece. If YouTube is blocked, Tubechop videos will not show, since they are "pulled" from YouTube.





YouTube — Start Video at a set time/location


Play your video to the desired start time. Right click directly on the video screen and select COPY VIDEO URL AT THE CURRENT TIME. You can paste that link into e-Campus; power point, a word document or email. The link will launch youtube and start your selected video at the desired time.
